The Challenge Before Us

In 2000, Reed Hastings and Marc Randolph the founders of a new young start-up—Netflix flew to Dallas, Texas to propose a partnership with the movie and video rental services giant— Blockbuster. Blockbuster at its peak had a market value of \$5 billion dollars, 60,000 employees, and over 9000 stores; they subsequently scoffed at the suggestion from Netflix. Blockbuster had the infrastructure, the network, and a governance structure to run a very profitable organization. They also declined to acquire Netflix that same year, thinking it was a niche business. In September of 2010, a mere ten years later, Blockbuster filed for bankruptcy and Netflix was worth \$28 billion in 2014. The very foundation and platform Blockbuster was founded on evaporated within a decade.

Likewise, mainline churches are also being eclipsed and displaced by sports, entertainment, and other activities. For generations churches were often at the center of community life. That is no longer the case. The fruits of the church—truth, beauty, the sacred, community—now take third and fourth place to self care and hedonism.

Wentz is not immune to these changes. The Presbyterian Church (USA) has lost 47% of its members since 1983, while the United Church of Christ has lost 49% since 1974 and the Disciples of Christ have lost a staggering 64% during the same time period. Similar declines have occurred in Rotary, Lions and other service organizations. Furthermore, even empires—Roman, Mayan, or Ottoman all declined over a short period of time. Sadly, they did not understand they were in decline before it was too late. We are once again experiencing a time of great disruption in technology, education, medicine, politics, and religion.

Organizations have several choices in how they respond: do nothing, close, merge, relocate; manage their decline or commit to bold and significant structural changes. Disney, Bank America, Nordstrom's, and 3M all experienced a significant decline and were able to retool and innovated for a changing landscape. The church has been resilient over the last two thousand years, weathering empires, monarchies, revolutions, and governments. Writer and futurist Alvin Toffler wrote that if you do not have a strategy you end up being part of someone else's strategy. Our test moving forward at Wentz will be how well we



understand the changing world and adapt. In order for us to be the beacon on the hill will require us to step into unknown spaces. Our time has come to step forward once again to be a community leader and be a dynamic, resilient, nimble faith community.



The Alzheimer's Solution: A Breakthrough Program to Prevent and Reverse the Symptoms of Cognitive Decline at Every Age, by Dean & Ayesha Sherzai. In brief, the book is about preventing, slowing the progression of Alzheimer's, and improving quality of life for those who are diagnosed. Alzheimer's is the sixth leading cause of death in 2016 and two thirds are women. It is the most expensive disease to manage and most costly researched with poor outcomes. The author's claim 90% can avoid getting Alzheimer's. Their solution is lifestyle based. We encourage you to read the book ahead of time, but it is not necessary for you to come and listen.




